## **How to make a Tudor house**



## You will need:

- A large box
- A small box
- Glue
- Masking tape
- Scissors
- A ruler
- 2 pieces of A4 card or 1 A3
- White paint
- Black card









Firstly, place the slightly larger box on top of the small one. When in position, stick them together.





Now, stick or tape your white card onto to the top box to form your roof. Trim as required and allow the paper to slightly overhang at the sides.




Secondly, accurately measure the sides of the larger box to create triangles. It's important the measurements are the same on both sides. This is how the roof will be formed.





The next step is to paint the boxes white. You may need to do two coats of paint! Wait a few minutes for this to dry.



Measure accurately and draw 15-20 small squares. Draw overlapping lines to create the window effect. A little bit like crosshatching!



Position and stick on the windows!



Using your black card, measure and cut out small strips to form your window frames. Once in position, stick them down.



To create the exposed framework, you will again need your black card. Look closely at how I have positioned mine. Feel free to position yours differently!

To finish the roof, I printed off some tile patterns. I then cut and stuck them in place. You could always make your own! The final step is to create and stick on the door. I didn't make a chimney, so if you are feeling particularly crafty you could also add this on.
